Explanation of Junior High detention: A detention is assigned by any teacher when a student has three checks in class. A student may receive a check for no homework as well as contrary behavior. A detention is also assigned when a student has three unexcused tardies. To serve a detention, a student will be given a topic sentence that deals with a character trait such as personal responsibility, diligence, initiative, self-control, and will write an essay on the topic at home. The student will have until the Monday after the assigned detention to turn in the completed, typed essay.

Consequences

Level 1: Detention – students will receive a ‘homework or behavioral mark’

- Three unexcused tardies equals a detention
- Three marks in a class period equals a detention (explanation above)
- 15 marks accumulated in any one-week period also equals a detention
- Failure to return the signed detention form = an additional detention
- Dangerous behavior (endangering students, assault, etc.) = immediate detention
- Three detentions = a parent conference

Level 2: Suspension

- Four detentions within a semester = a suspension: time spent out of school doing school work missed during the suspension plus an additional assignment
 - The first suspension = one day
 - The second suspension = two days
 - The third suspension = three to five days
- At the beginning of a new semester, the record of detentions will be wiped clean
- Suspensions will stay on the record for the year

Level 3: Expulsion

- Three suspensions = parent conference about procedure for expulsion
- The fourth suspension = expulsion
- Some dangerous or threatening behaviors can also lead directly to expulsion
